And immediately I realized why it's an American gem. The **Grand Tetons** set the backdrop for a varied and spectacular vacation no matter the time of year.

If you're considering taking a few days off this winter, make your way to Jackson Hole. After a short 5-day visit to the valley I found more than 20 reasons to go (and back again), but here 5 major convincing ones:

3. The food scene is better than you could ever imagine. From whole-in-wall cowboy bars with escavated tree trunks to fine dining, every palate is served. A favorite is **Bin22**, the only wine and tapas restaurant in the city, which features wines from all over Latin America, Europe, and Australia. The unexpected ultra-chic space has dishes out more 40 tapa options – all come extremely close to what you'd find in Spain thought the chef isn't Español. Order the chocolate sausage for dessert. Thank me later.
