



Many people travel to Jackson Hole, the picturesque and wildlife-speckled valley that surrounds the charming town of Jackson, Wyoming, to access the two nearby National Parks (Grand Teton is under 20 minutes away by car, the southern entrance to Yellowstone is a scenic hour-long drive) or the exhilarating ski slopes. An array of accommodations populates these parks, mountains and the neighboring towns, from quaint and rustic to remote and luxurious. None are quite like the newest addition to this hospitality haven, The Cloudveil, Autograph Collection hotel, which opened earlier this year on Jackson's historic Town Square.

Restaurateur Gavin Fine created The Cloudveil's restaurant (which includes an outdoor cafe), The Bistro. It specializes in seasonal dishes and comforting classics amidst a convivial environment. "Gavin and chef Roger, they've been in the valley since 2001," Dombroski says. "We wanted a partner that was connected to the destination. He does all the food and beverage for the property, including the rooftop and room service. It's all the same quality as The Bistro." The Bistro is the realization of Fine's longtime dream to have a French-influenced restaurant in Jackson.
