### Jackson, Wyoming

[Jackson, Wyoming](#), is the perfect hub for exploring two well-known foliage destinations: [Yellowstone National Park](#) and the [Grand Tetons](#). When the temperatures cool down, and the Aspen trees turn a patchwork of gold and red, the atmosphere of this mountain town (which normally hosts a population of just 11,000 full-time residents) feels as vibrant as the leaves on the trees.
