It certainly built up an appetite too. So we headed for exceptionally good pizza at the swanky Osteria restaurant at the base of Teton

Village (£12, jhosteria.com), part of local Gavin Fine's Fine Dining Restaurant Group.

This is the other side of Jackson Hole, miles away from the Wild West stereotype, and one of the many reasons the town's culinary scene is enjoying a reputation to match that of the skiing.

Fine, an intensely charismatic ski bum-turned-restauranteur, is at the heart of this culinary renaissance. He teamed up with chef Roger Freedman back in 2001 to create the Fine Dining Group and today they run six restaurants.

Rendezvous, the bistro that was their first opening, is still the group's flagship and offers a subtle take on 'French-American' classics – duck confit, steak frites and the like – as well as a Raw Bar offering oysters and tuna tartare.
