JACKSON HOLE, WYOMING

It used to be dubbed “The Big One” for its extensive backcountry access, but to the chagrin of some locals, Jackson Hole is becoming “All New, All Blue”—a reference to the color of the intermediate ski trails—ahead of its 50th anniversary next season. Nestled in Grand Teton National Park, Jackson Hole has just about every activity a family could ask for, from ski camps to snow-coach tours to snow tubing. Friends of Pathways has helped build the largest series of bike and Nordic ski trails in the Lower 48; try snow-biking on the just-opened pedestrian bridge over the Snake River, a superb engineering feat. Whiskey enthusiasts should tour the Wyoming Whiskey distillery, a local brand established in 2006 not yet available east of the Mississippi. Back in town, be sure to indulge at one of the five restaurants that make up the award-winning Fine Dining Restaurant Group created by chefs Gavin Fine and Roger Freedman.

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
